

A month of celebrations



LOHRI

We celebrated the North Indian festival of Lohri, that heralds the coming of spring, on 13th January with a bonfire. Even though the evening was chilly, our students showed no sign of it as the warmth of the bonfire and the joyful singing of traditional songs warmed every heart with an anticipation of milder weather to come. Madhavi House hosted a short programme to explain the significance of Lohri and spoke about how it is connected with the harvesting of the Rabi crop. This was followed by a rendition of a Punjabi song and a dance performance. In complying with ancient traditions, staff and students took turns round the fire, symbolically offering revadi, popcorn and groundnuts as an oblation to the presiding deity.

CBSE capacity building programme workshop





On 4th January, we played host to a CBSE Capacity Building Programme Workshop on the remodelled structure of assessment for secondary classes. The event was attended by the concerned faculty of SKV, who were joined by teachers from a few other institutions in Madhya Pradesh. The day-long workshop was led by Ms. Neha Sharma and Mr. Vikram Singh and was divided into five sessions. The workshop provided valuable insights into the teaching and learning process of the recent CBSE curriculum, including forms of assessment and portfolio building.

Self-defence workshop

On 11th and 12th January we organized a Self Defence Workshop for the entire staff, including academic, administrative, hostel, housekeeping, security and support staff. Ms. Dipti Shankar and her team from Safe Campus conducted 6 sessions for all our 170 staff members.

CBSE workshop at DPS Gwalior

On 15th January, two teachers from SKV participated in a training programme organized by the CBSE in collaboration with the Aurobindo Society. Held at DPS Gwalior, the event featured Mr. Muneesh Patel from Sri Aurobindo Society, who gave an interesting talk about innovative pathshalas and zero investment innovations for education initiatives (ZIIEI).

Microbial culture workshop

The first meeting of Vigyan Prasar Network (VIPNET) of Science Clubs was held on 20th January. 26 students from various schools, along with their teachers, attended the 4th workshop on microbial culture. The participating schools included Vidya Bhavans Public School, The Woodstock School, IATS Public School, The Radiant School and Scindia Kanya Vidyalaya

Students were briefed on microbes and culturing techniques before they were given handson experience of preparing culture mediums - such as streaking on bacterial cultures on agar plates and staining and observing bacteria from both soil and curd samples.

The workshop provided our students with an opportunity to learn first-hand about microbiology. The planned exercises were performed with much enthusiasm and left the participants with a keen desire to further explore the microbial world on the internet and undertake additional projects in the field.

Punyatithi of our beloved Founder H.H Rajmata Vijayaraje Scindia

25th January 2020 marked the 19th death anniversary (Punyatithi) of our beloved founder, Her Highness Rajmata Vijayaraje Scindia ji. In the morning, prayers and floral tributes were offered to her memory and later in the day, under the sponsorship of our service project SANKALP, sanitary napkins were distributed to the Sahayikas of the school to mark the occasion.



When referring to the founding of Scindia Kanya Vidyalaya, Her Highness Vijaya Raje Scindia once said, "I felt the Indian woman was drifting away from her valuable heritage. The progress of science along with industrialization it brought, changed the old pattern of family life. Because of economic conditions, Indian women had to come out, (and) also add to the family income. I believe in the old adage, 'the hand that rocks the cradle rules the world'. I wanted a school to strengthen those hands. My dream was to start a school which would serve both these ends"


